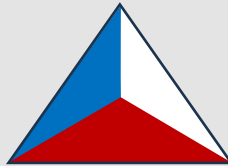

“Winds of War The Surgeon’s Responsibility for National Readiness(Part II)”

C. William “Bill” Schwab founded the trauma center and flight programs at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Schwab and the Penn Team pioneered many aspects of the Damage Control Surgery, an approach to life-threatening injury now integral to trauma surgery worldwide. From his experiences with the United States Navy, Dr. Schwab coined the phrase Damage Control to emphasize the need to control bleeding with unconventional techniques to improve survival. Beyond his scholastic work, Dr. Schwab is recognized for his work in developing trauma systems and trauma centers.

Dr. Schwab has over 350 publications, has co-edited four textbooks on clinical trauma care, ballistic injury, and damage control management. He has been awarded honorary memberships in the Royal College of Surgeons of Scotland (Glasgow), Swedish Surgical Association and European Society of Trauma and Emergency Surgery. Bill has served as the President of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma and the International Association for Trauma Surgery and Intensive Care.

Dr. Schwab received his surgical training in the United States Navy and served on active duty from 1970-1980. Bill has remained a strong advocate for improving military trauma training. In 2019, under his direction, Penn Medicine and the United States Navy established a partnership for advanced trauma training of military teams. Dr. Schwab is currently the senior advisor to the Military Readiness Training and Sustainment Center for the United States Navy at the University of Pennsylvania.
